## Week beginning 20th March 2023

This week's learning highlights:

News from Infants (Reception, Y1 and Y2)

We enjoyed looking for signs of spring this week as part of our theme during Science lessons. We were all surprised to see so many lovely blossoms on our school trees already. We continued measuring this week using centimetres and thought about how to measure time in Reception. We have been impressed with the enthusiasm from the children this week too and their interest in learning. Well done everyone! - From Mrs Nash







Year 2 worked hard on some tricky maths problems this week and they've shown how to apply their skills across the four operations  $(+ - x \div)$  to solve two step problems. In English, the children delved deeper into the text Grandpa's Island and thought about what their own island might be like, and what they would do there if they had one. There were some great ideas including creating a swinging bridge, treehouse, catching fish using a spear and roasting it on their own campfire.

In Science, the Butterflies (Year 1/2) have monitored their cress and bean experiments by looking closely at the best conditions for optimum growth and consolidated their measuring skills by using rulers to measure the length of their beans. We've also been out and about looking for signs of spring, it's definitely on its way now! - From Mrs Oake.



News from the Juniors (KS2 - Y3, Y4, Y5 & Y6)

Year 3 and 4 this week finished their class book The Enchanted Horse. Together we reviewed the book and most in class were able to predict the ending. We have enjoyed reading this together and sharing our opinions with the rest of the class. During literacy this week we created a role on the wall for the main character Irina and organised the facts we knew about her into categories ready for next week's description. The class have also been practising their Easter performance and are looking forward to their moment to shine at the church next week.

This week Year 5 and 6 really impressed us with their dedication to learning; they should be very impressed with what they achieved! We learnt about different grammatical devices and applied these to our oracy and writing. When we discussed the degree of possibility of something happening, we used model verbs to explain the likeliness of an Asian Elephants' calf being stolen from the herd. We know this does occasionally happen in the wild. The children worked hard to inform everyone how likely it would be for their calf to be stolen or not.
