This week's learning highlights:

News from the Infants (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2)

The Infants thoroughly enjoyed their first swimming session this week! The bad weather did not dampen their spirits and they all listened well at the start when the swimming coach gave us a safety talk. In the pool, all of the children listened carefully to the instructions and worked really hard. Well done Bess and ladybirds - we are looking forward to seeing the progress you make with your swimming this term!

News from the Juniors (Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6)

Year 3 and 4 have got straight into their fraction learning, recalling brilliantly what they already know and beginning to apply this to their new learning.

In literacy we have begun our poetry unit. Wow what enthusiasm from all the children! Everyone has a new Poetry Jotter and many of the children took these out to lunch break to begin their jotting. I am really looking forward to reading and hearing their poems.



This week the children have been introduced to their new Geography topic The United Kingdom and our region. We spent some time talking about the United Kingdom and how this is made up of 4 countries, we used atlases to then check the names of these countries and their capital cities. The children also used the atlases to try to find some different places around the country with clues that they had been given. They had a lot of fun discovering some new places. In French this week we have been learning how to say the time to the hour and half hour. Year 5 and 6 have been looking at their new science topic: Forces. This week, we focused on gravity and how it works and we learnt that if the earth lost gravity for just 5 seconds it would have serious consequences, including buildings being pulled from the ground, there would be no air or water and we would start to float, although this would be dangerous we found out! Next week the children are conducting experiments to see if all objects fall at the same rate, watch this space for our conclusions next week!
