News from Infants (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

The Infants were puzzled to find a rather strange recipe in the classroom this week, along with lots of items that had been moved around. It led to some fantastic question writing and discussions of the possible reasons. Thankfully we discovered it was all part of our story this week - Billy And The Beast.

Reception children have wowed us this week as they begin their phonics learning and have enjoyed exploring maths in all sorts of different ways. Their attitude, effort and enthusiasm to their learning has been wonderful to see!

The Year 1 children have also done some brilliant maths work by practicing their counting skills and the Year 2 children have refined their partitioning skills and understanding of place value. We can't wait to see what learning takes place next week!



News from the Juniors




We had a great time at LynnSport this week!

We've had the rappers in the class this week, presenting their version of the poem Jackdaw by Robert MacFarlane. We were able to join definitions to tricky words in the poem such as 'fossick' - to hunt or seek, 'guffaw' - a hearty laugh. Later in the week, we worked on identifying nouns and adjectives, before adapting simple sentences to create expanded noun phrases.

Year 3's have been working hard on their Place Value skills and have impressed Mrs Cross of their ability to partition 3 digit numbers. We are working on adding and taking away 1, 10 and 100 by playing Human Bingo.

Roman Numerals were the focus for Year 4 this week. Pupils enjoyed forming their own RN with lollipop sticks before solving worded problems together as a group.



This week year 5 and 6 have been really enjoying their english project on the Guardians Three Little Pigs Advert. The children have only watched a small amount of the advert and have been speculating as to what has happened. They have found out that the Wolf is dead and it seems the Three Little Pigs have killed him. We have talked about bias and how this can affect what people think. This led to the children questioning if the Pigs were right to defend their home from the Wolf. They then had to debate if the Pigs had done the right thing, the children were amazing! They had brilliant arguments for and against, those defending the Wolf, made some very valid points, including that the Wolf was reformed and was actually a vegetarian, he was also only trying to help the pigs as he thought the house was on fire and he was just trying to get the keys after the pigs locked themselves out. However, those for the Pigs did a brilliant job and convinced the judges, Miss Harrold and Mrs Frost that they had the right and should be able to defend their home- although we did agree that killing the Wolf was a bit far. We would like to commend the year 5 and 6 for this brilliant work, it has been lovely to see them so into it.
