News from Infants (Reception, Y1 and Y2)

We were delighted to welcome a visitor into our class this week to talk about food from the past. Bella's Grandma joined us to share her experiences of school lunches and to show us cookery books and recipes from her childhood. We were amazed at some of the differences between dishes from our school lunches in the present compared to those from the 1950s. We have continued this learning through our own recipe writing too.



Well done to all children who have shown such resilience through the hot weather this week! In English, the children have enjoyed looking at different recipes, identifying verbs and adverbs in order to select suitable words ready to write their own recipes very soon. The children had a brilliant time reading instructions to make their own dough, they loved kneading it and getting sticky fingers! In science, the children have been studying habitats. We visited our own local habitat in the woodlands and discussed how we know when something is alive. We went on to identify different things that were previously alive, are alive or have never been alive.

After lunch, during our visit to the Fishermen's Lifeboat museum they found out that the lifeboat was built in 1894 and is still in the original shed from where it was first launched. Attached to this was the Shell Gallery and the children were in awe of the amazing shell structures. All in all we had a great day out in Sheringham, in the sunshine, learning and discovering facts about our local area.
