News from the Infants (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2)

This week the Ladybirds have started reading a new text "Look Up" that should get them super excited about their "Space" theme. We love to let them steer the way and so are really looking forward to finding out where this learning journey will take us.

They have already nearly finished learning all the letter sounds in level 2 of our phonics scheme. This means they can now put these sounds together to read and write lots of simple words. They have been practicing "stretching" words and saying them in their "robot voice" order to hear all the sounds. They are getting really good. Why not have a go at "Robot voices" at home? "Come on it's time for b-e-d." "Please get the m-a-p."

Ask them, they will show you how we do it.

The Bees have been practicing some essential design and technology skills this week and have been improving their scissor cutting, folding and printing ability. They have made some awesome Halloween craft using these skills.

They have also learned how to identify nouns and verbs and use them in their writing. They have all produced a poem about water using the different names (nouns) for water sources and describing them with verbs. Year 2 even know how to change a verb depending on the type of sentence. Clever stuff!
