News from the Infants (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2)

We have had a great week (now we are back in the swing of things!) and have loved getting to know our new friends. Welcome to the gang Ruby, Rose and Kolney, it has been great to start to get to know you.

The ladybirds have been loving their new Literacy text "I am Henry Finch" and it has inspired them to learn about fingerprints. Maisie told us, "everyone's fingerprints are unique," and Oliver explained how they had used sticky tape to "collect" their own fingerprints. They are all budding detectives! They were brilliantly independent whilst getting ready for our P.E. session on Friday, even the tricky jumpers were done by themselves!

The Bees have begun a maths unit of learning all about money. Year 1 looked very closely at different coins and made rubbings of them whilst year 2 have been busy making and counting amounts of money with pounds and pence. We enjoyed using "coin calculator" to help us. Why not give it a try using this link <u>Coin calculator</u>. They have also been learning about different types of words (nouns, verbs and adjectives) knowing the difference and using them in their writing. We have begun our new topic "great inventions" and have loved being inventors in our "Invention Station" role play. This week we learned about the invention of the telephone. News from the Juniors (Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6)

This week we have been looking at our new Geography topic, comparing the Western United States and our region. The children had some really good knowledge of our local area and used atlases and maps to find some of the different features we have here. They were excited to learn that we will be learning about volcanoes, earthquakes, biomes and climate zones within our topic, and look out for our fabulous finale in March. There might be some demonstrations for you to see! We have been working hard in French this week and learning about the different names for household pets. We are undertaking a project to write our own mini French books this half term, based on the Very Hungry Caterpillar. We were very lucky this week to talk to some scientists from Canada, who are currently working in the arctic, it's amazing what a zoom call can do! We got to learn about what it is like there with it being -50 we think cold and not so nice. We got to find out about what they are researching and why they made the trip up to this very harsh climate. The children had some brilliant questions and we learned so much! Thank you to Miss Harrold's cousin Emily who is one of the scientists that we spoke to, alongside two of her colleagues, one who is exploring how animals in the Arctic are being affected by climate change, and one who used to work on projects about space! They got up super early to talk to us, it was 6am there! It was great to hear all about what people are researching and how people live in the cold climates.


