
This week's learning highlights:


News from the Infants (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2)

We have enjoyed a lot of creative activities this week, from dancing like ocean creatures, to learning about body percussion and copying rhythms, to designing and making bird feeders (ladybirds) and writing poetry based on our class text "The comet" (Bees). It has been a fun and productive week!

The Bees have mastered some tricky maths work and now know the difference between pounds and pence. They have been calculating with money and have used different strategies to do this. Their poetry writing was amazing (see below), they worked so hard and were able to write a poem in the role of the main character in the text. Oriel especially immersed herself in the role of "Nyla" and looked deeply into how the character may be feeling.

The Ladybirds have also been inspired by their text "I am Henry Finch" and have made some awesome bird feeders. We look forward to seeing if we can attract some birdie visitors to our outside area.

News from the Juniors (Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6)

This week we have been very busy with all our lessons. In science year 5 and 6 we have been investigating how our eyes work and the fact that actually images enter our eyes upside down and our brains process these images to turn it the right way up. We discussed the different functions of the parts of our eyes and how they all work together. Year 3 and 4 have been investigating how durable and permeable the different rocks are. We discovered granite was the most hard wearing and chalk was the least. Year 5 and 6 have been practicing measuring angles in maths and had fun measuring angles on the tables and writing the angles on the table. To many astonished faces and exclaims of WE CAN DRAW ON THE TABLES!! They had lots of fun and got to practice this important skill.
