# News from the Juniors (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6)

After welcoming the children back from their half term break the week has been busy and fun-filled. We have learnt about the features of rivers in Geography and even created our own mini-rivers, in sandboxes, carefully labelling the features.





In Y3/4 English we have been learning about avalanches and cyclones and writing a news report. In Maths we have been adding and subtracting fractions.

In English Y5/6 children have created their own 'Lost Thing' and developed a story plan using their own innovative ideas. They will be using their plans and aspects of writing techniques alongside the grammatical devices learnt so far, to write their own stories. We are looking forward to sharing their stories.
