This week's learning highlights:

# News from Infants (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

We have had a great first week back in the infants and we were so encouraged to see everyone return happily and full of enthusiasm!

We introduced our new theme and the children are keen to discover more about the world we live in. There are lots of learning observations loaded onto Tapestry so do look out on there for more information on what we have been up to! It was good to see so many of you join us for the parent meetings as well this week. These chats are such a good way to touch base together and keep each other informed on life at school and at home. We always enjoy having these opportunities to get to know families a little more and to share the children's achievements and progress with you too. In science, the children have enjoyed learning more about the benefits of exercise and have noticed how their bodies and minds change for the better after they have exercised.

They were all incredibly enthusiastic about returning to Lynnsport this week and practiced their rolling, jumping and balancing skills on the apparatus.

Their new text 'Cave Baby' has inspired the children to think about writing their own imaginative ideas for if they were to have their own cave and what they would have in it. Perhaps we will have a go at making our own soon?!

#### News from the Juniors

This week in Lower Juniors we have been enjoying our new books 'Varmints' for writing and 'Skygazing' for reading. For writing we have been reminding ourselves of how to take care of plants and what seeds need to grow. In Maths we have started our new topic: Multiplication and Division, looking at the patterns that they have and how they are grouped together.

Our Value leaders enjoyed a trip round the village yesterday to help a local group write a walk route with sights to see. We are excited about our Christmas play: 'Christmas with the aliens' which we have started learning the songs for.

Upper Juniors have kicked off the new half term with a very busy week. In maths learning about prime factors, square and cubed numbers and how to multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1000 and in English writing dream scenes, poetry and even tweets. In science we have been investigating how to separate materials using filtration, sieves and magnets while trying not to make too much of a mess with sand, salt, rice, water, raisins and paper clips. In history, while learning the reasons Boudicca led a rebellion on the Romans, the children wrote and performed a rallying speech by Bouddica to encourage her fellow Icenis to revolt. The music teacher is very impressed by the progress the children are making with learning the trombones: playing different notes, reading music, changing tempo and working in unison.

It has also been a pleasure to celebrate some amazing homework projects that were completed over the half term break. The children were tasked to write about something they love or a hobby they enjoy. Several children chose to present their work in poetry and others entertained us with very informative power point presentations. We learnt about Jujutsu, golf, rugby and how to look after bunny rabbits - all very impressive, so well done. A great start to the second half of the Autumn term.


