

# News from Infants (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

The children have immersed themselves in their learning throughout the week, they've enjoyed using the beautiful resources of Autumn in their activities such as conkers and leaves to practice their counting, drawing and exploration.

The Reception children are continuing to impress us all with their phonics knowledge and it was wonderful to see them wow their parents at the Reception phonics open morning, it was great to welcome you all in.

In maths, the Key Stage 1 children have become well equipped at spotting and solving doubles and near doubles. They have become super speedy with their recall on these!

Our science session was a lot of fun as we explored measuring each other's feet to investigate if our feet really do get bigger as we get older, even Mrs Oake and Mrs Ridgwell got involved! We've also been practicing our Harvest Festival songs and we look forward to singing these at the

#### News from the Juniors

In the Lower Juniors this week, we have enjoyed writing about our own matchbox diary objects. We have been reading the start of our new book 'Zombierella,' predicting what we think will happen and picking out how 'fake' the sisters were.

We enjoyed our last session at LynnSport this week, where we have been refining our gymnastics skills.





In RE this week, we learnt about the importance of prayer in the daily life of the Islam faith. The children had the opportunity to look at a prayer mat, design one of their own and create a whole class mat using interactive paint on the whiteboard.

During Science this week the children conducted their experiment to find out which material is the best thermal insulator. They covered cups with different materials and measured the temperature of warm water at 5 minute intervals to find out which materials kept the heat in for the longest. We will write up our results next week.

Y5 and 6 also enjoyed our first lesson with the Music Teacher (Mr Head) who took us right back in time to discover the origins of different genres of music in America and the UK.
