

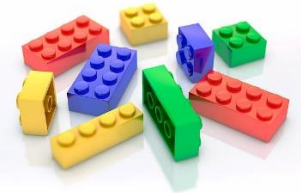

Join Garlic Theatre for this funny, bug-tastic adventure, with clowning, a beautifully crafted set, colourful puppets and foot tapping music.



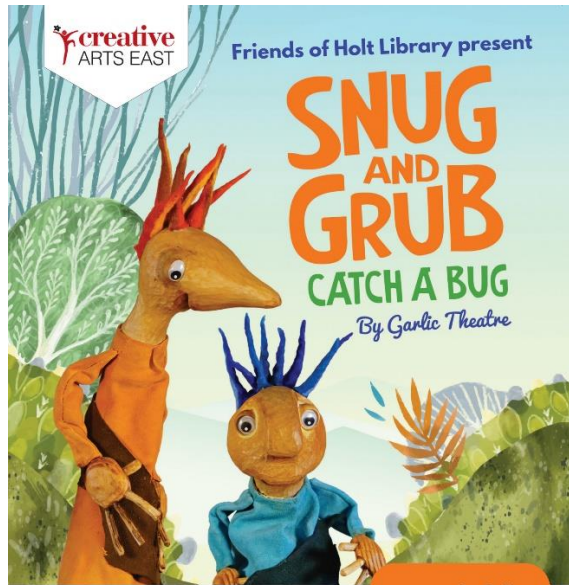
