We have a busy and fun week in the juniors with lots of exciting things happening. Year 5 and 6 started their week making protest signs for and against the Three Little Pigs and how they had been treated. They really enjoyed getting into these characters and came up with some brilliant signs. Year 3 and 4 have been hard at work writing their own versions of Leon and the Place Between, we have some beautiful stories taking shape. We had our Romans trip to Norwich Castle this week. The children got to meet a Roman soldier and an Iceni Tribe member who had a decision to make. Then throughout four activities the children had to help the Iceni Tribe member to decide what he should do. They got to look at and make their own Torcs with an archaeologist, they investigated real Roman artefacts, looked at the power of the Romans and Iceni were. We learnt that the Romans were far more powerful and advanced than the Iceni. The children had great fun on the trip, pictures to come next week. In science year 5/6 have been exploring magnets and year 3/4 have been conducting local habitat searches.
