
Week beginning 18th November 2024

This week's learning highlights:

News from Infants (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

It may have been chilly outside this week but we have kept busy and warm in the infants! The children have thoroughly enjoyed discovering interesting facts about caves from around the world, linking to our book 'Cave Baby' and this has brought about some wonderful independent writing of fact sheets and information books! The weather also linked well to our exploration of caves as we looked at ice caves too. The ice in our outside area wasn't quite like that in an ice cave but we enjoyed looking closely at how ice can change the way objects look and feel. Albie snapped a piece of ice in his hands and told us: "It's so cold but look, it's so shiny and see-through!" The children are growing in confidence and ability week by week at their gymnastics sessions at Lynnsport, we can't believe next week will be our last session! This week the children even did backwards rolls!

In Science, the Infants took part in a super fun experiment using glitter on their hands to represent how germs can easily travel and spread, the glitter was tricky to wash off every last bit

News from the Juniors

This week in Lower Juniors, we have enjoyed combining Science and English in our writing: an explanation text about how plants grow. We have read more about what happens in the sky at night time: auroras and amazing night creatures. In Maths we have been looking at patterns in our times tables, 6's. 9's and 12's, what a lot of patterns there are! In Art, we have been sketching our paintings for our PFA Art gallery show and, of course, we have started acting out our play, ready for Christmas!


Even though it has been a chilly week the Y5/6 children have worked hard. We are so proud of their Fabulous Fraction work this week: identifying equivalent fractions on number lines; converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa and using reasoning skills to solve more challenging fraction problems. In English, the children were given time to complete an extended piece of writing, developing their skills of editing and improving their work, while understanding it takes time to perfect a good piece of writing. Their objective was to write an informative blog that gives advice about lessons learnt on an Arctic expedition, including grammar and writing skills they have learnt over the term. The children were asked to copy a part of their writing that they were most proud of. The samples here are from Ruby, Freddie, Charlie and Bethany.

The children have also been practising their sewing skills using running stitch and over stitch in preparation for making Roman purses. Meanwhile, we are seeing remarkable progress in their music skills, creating some rhythmic tunes with the trombones, on Wednesday afternoons. We are looking forward to seeing what more they all can achieve, across their learning in the coming weeks.
