Christmas Performance 2024

News from the Juniors (Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6

This week year 3 and 4 have been investigating how the viscosity of a liquid affects how it will flow. We investigated four different liquids, Water, BBQ sauce, Cooking oil and Honey to see which would flow down the ramp quicker. We had to predict which liquid would reach the bottom first. We tested the different liquids and found out that water flowed the fastest and BBQ sauce went the slowest- it did not reach the bottom we had to stop the clock!- we did find that changing how the ramp was set up made some liquids flow quicker as well. Year 5 and 6 have been researching different animals that have adaptations for the area they live in. We have all been having fun creating clay models this week. Year 3 and 4 have been making their perfect pets and year 5 and 6 have been creating demons for the stories they are going to be writing later in the half term. They had great fun coming up with these. In PE the Juniors have been learning some netball skills, passing, shooting and pivoting. They were brilliant this week and Rob commented it was one of the best lessons so far this year! The juniors also went to cross country this week, and despite not having much time to prepare they did a fabulous job, everyone tried super hard and should be proud of how they did. Well done to Maud for coming home with second place in her race.
