This week's learning highlights:

News from Infants (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

The infants have continued to enjoy our 'Emergency' theme this week and have been fascinated by our focus on Florence Nightingale and the role she played in emergencies of the past! We have also completed further challenges inspired by our class book 'Naughty Bus' and have noticed how the style of text within the story reflects the meaning of the words. We have made our own visual representations of words too and the children have created some wonderful word artwork! They even had a go at writing about the events from the 'Naughty Bus' as reporters for their own headline newspaper articles!

In ICT we used the bee bots alongside maps that we created ourselves and also floor maps, we enjoyed taking turns giving and listening to the instructions to program the bee bots to reach the right destinations.

In science, we started to look at different materials, how to identify them, what they feel like and words to describe them. We also thought about how different materials can be used for a variety of important jobs. We also enjoyed going on a materials hunt around school to identify wood, plastic, metal, foam, clay and rubber items.



News from the Juniors

This week is lower juniors, we have been enjoying learning and writing fact sheets about rats while learning about the Pied Piper story in Reading and Writing.

In Maths we have been learning about lengths, measuring with rulers, metre sticks and km wheels as well as comparing equivalent lengths.

In Science, we learnt about things that reflect and how important it is to be seen especially when it is darker. In Art we have enjoyed studying different Artists and sketching out our own ideas for our volcano paintings.

In PE we have been practising upper body stretches and our hockey skills as well as our swimming sessions!



This week in Year 5/6, we've been busy bees! Noah W and Charlie have been our fantastic reporters, diligently observing and documenting all our exciting learning adventures this week. Get ready to dive into their insightful report as they share the highlights and capture the essence of our week in their own voices.

'What the Yr 5-6 class have done this week has been: We started the week with bikeability where the children have learnt to ride safely on the road, the signals you need to do whilst on the road to keep safe, how to stand on the clean side of the bike (no chains), the positions on the road to keep safe and lastly a bike check (abcd). We received a certificate each for all passing! Meanwhile the people that didn't do bikeability played some fun learning games and made some really nice presentations on global warming.

For the rest of the week, we have been doing division in maths! For division we have been learning to divide a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number which we have been picking up really well, we love division! In English we have been reading a new story about Malala Yousafzai, a well-respected woman by many. Malala has been awarded the Nobel peace prize. Malala speaks up about girl's rights to go to school. We have been doing verbal and written summaries about what we have read of this book so far.

We have also done computing, where we have been doing programming using commands and conditions on scratch. We have also been trying a new thing, google classroom where we can send documents and message each other. So you could say this week has been pretty good.
