News from the Infants (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2)

This week all the infants have been working really hard and we have noticed a real improvement in their focus and concentration.

The Bees have been continuing to explore hot places around the world and have watched some videos about rural life in India. They were able to compare it to their own lives and were surprised at some of the poverty we saw.

The Ladybirds have been continuing to learn about transport and have had a great time learning about traffic lights. Their bike riding skills need a bit of practice but they certainly were determined.

In maths the Bees have been adding and subtracting and have really impressed me with some great mental skills. We have learned that knowing our bonds for 10 is crucial for working out lots of other facts. Keep practicing at home!

News from the Juniors (Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year

This week in maths the year5/6s have been looking at division. To help us with our reasoning we used the mathematical vocabulary of 'dividend', 'divisor' and 'quotient'. We explored long and short division and noted how, when using factors, we can be more efficient in our calculating. We applied our knowledge to 'real life' problems noting the importance of how to deal with remainders. Molly, Matilda and Anna created their own division problems.

Another week of drive and dynamism saw the year 3/4s sink their teeth into multiplication.

With great enthusiasm we saw terrific scores in the Times Tables weekly challenge. We are tracking our mean average scores on a line graph with the Year 3s hot on the heels of the year 5s!



This week year five and six have been looking at their new book Stonewall Inn all about the riots and movements in New York in the 1960s and 70s. They have really enjoyed this and got into character at the start of the week to act out the words uprising and revolution. The children have really engaged in this book and also produced adverts for Stonewall Inn. Year three and year four have also been introduced to the new book this week, Escape from Pompeii. They have been looking in depth at the first page trying to find all points of interest and then writing their own setting descriptions to describe what they could see and where this is in relation to the city of Pompeii using prepositions to show this. They also had a go at freeze framing and unlocking a character with one child 'frozen' while another gave them a voice. In science year five and six have been looking at Electricity. This week they had a go at making their own simple circuits and then adding in more complicated parts to see what changed in the circuit. they discovered that if you had too many components the batteries need to be a higher voltage or you need more batteries for this to work correctly. They also looked at the scientific symbols for the components in a circuit.
