












#### News from the Juniors

This week in years 3 and 4 we have been writing our stories based on the Pied Piper up in best for our class book, reviewing our writing as we go. We have been learning about mixed and improper fractions and finding fraction families.

In Science we learnt how mirrors reflect light and reviewed our learning about Science this half term.

In PE we have enjoyed learning different stretch and muscle strengthening techniques as well as practising some hockey.

For Mindfulness Monday this week we've started to practise self-kindness, being positive about our successes and being kind to ourselves. In Maths we've been learning to multiply a fraction by an integer, like  $\frac{1}{2} \times 1 = \frac{1}{2}$ . In Collective Worship we have learnt about responsibility. We read a book called the Last Garden. There was a garden owned by a young girl. She took care of the garden very well. This was during the war and kids took care of it with her and took some food (with her permission). The garden was destroyed by the war after she had to leave it. When she got back it was like a jungle in a small environment.

For RE we have been learning about sacrifice in the Muslim Book, the Quran and also how Humanists are people who don't believe in God or a religion but still do good and make sacrifices too. Like donating to charity or just making the world a better place. In geography we have been learning about the continents, oceans and capitals like Budapest in Hungary and Athens in Greece and we have even learned about landmarks.

In computing we have been programming our own quiz about space, geography or maths etc. and when the player answers the question right or wrong the character does something in response.
